

## **Dear Parents,**

Welcome to the second spring term! With longer days and warmer weather ahead, we are looking forward to an exciting and productive half term.

In Mathematics, our focus will be on decimals, fractions, percentages, and statistics. This set of 25 SATs-style questions may serve as a useful end-of-topic reminder. Additionally, BBC Bitesize offers excellent resources to support your child's learning. Another highly recommended website is <https://mathsbot.com/primary/ks2>, which generates arithmetic papers and marks them automatically.

In Writing this half term, Year 6 will be exploring two exciting texts. First, using *After the War*, children will learn how to write their own flashback narratives, focusing on rich description, dialogue to move the story forward, and crafting a clear story structure. They will also develop key grammar skills, including ellipses, linking ideas across paragraphs, expanded noun phrases, and the passive voice. Later, inspired by the poem *The Highwayman*, pupils will write a diary entry in role, using formal vocabulary, historical language, and emotional detail to bring the character's voice to life.

In History, we will continue to explore World War II and the Battle of Britain, linking our history lessons closely with our reading and writing work.

Our Science topic this half term is the human circulatory system. Children will identify and name the main parts of the system, describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels, and blood, and explore how nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

PE sessions remain on Thursdays and Fridays. On Thursdays, we will be doing dance, and on Fridays we will focus on tennis.

In ICT, we will explore *Data and Information – Introduction to Spreadsheets*. Learners will understand the importance of formatting data for calculations, apply formulas across multiple cells, use spreadsheets to plan an event, and create charts to evaluate results.

In PSHE, we will explore money management, including how to keep money safe, understanding financial risks such as gambling, and managing finances in secondary school. We will also discuss career options and the pathways to different professions.

A gentle reminder that homework booklets are due on the following days: Grammar on Mondays, Reading on Wednesdays, and Mathematics on Fridays.
