It has been lovely to welcome the children back for the final half term of the year. As always, the year has flown by and it is hard to believe we have arrived at June so soon!

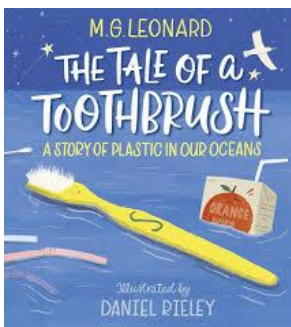
We have 7 busy weeks ahead, with Healthy Week, transition plans, the Music Festival and picnics being just a few of the highlights we have to look forward to.

We will continue to send out the Friday email summarising the upcoming events – which we hope you are finding useful. You can also see the list of events on the calendar on the school website.

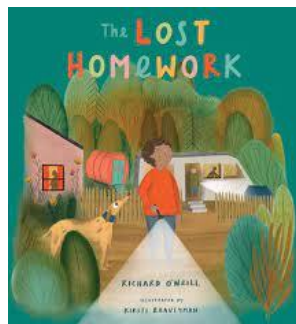
